At the end of every 10:00AM service, we invite everyone to join us for Coffee Hour. We welcome the opportunity to meet you, introduce ourselves and respond to your questions and needs.

## Children and Youth Programs

All children are welcomed at Trinity and they participate in all aspects of our church life. During the 10:00 AM worship we offer child care and Christian education.

- **Nursery care** is available for infants, toddlers and pre-school children every Sunday.
- Godly Play is offered to children from pre-school to 5<sup>th</sup> grade during the academic school year (September June). The children are grouped by age: preschool, kindergarten and 1<sup>st</sup> grade children are in one room; 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade children are together in another room. Godly Play begins at 9:45 AM and children are dismissed in time to join their family for the Eucharist. - Sunday school classes for middle school youth (grades 6 8) are offered during the academic school year (September June). Drawing from Scripture, with an occasional dabbling in popular music and film, classes explore the meaning of Christian faith in the context of family life, school, and our complex and often confusing world.
- **High School Youth** are engaged in community service projects, learn about Christian spirituality, and get to know each other better in a safe and fun environment. Participation in High School Youth Group meetings and events may lead to **Confirmation**, if that is the choice of the teen.
- **Baptism.** Parents should speak with clergy or call the Parish office.
- Worship participation. Hand bell choir is open to older school children and middle school youth. Acolyte training is provided to youth who express a wish to actively participate in worship.
